Key vocabulary

Primary Colour	Any of a group of colours from which all other colours can be obtained by mixing.
Secondary colour	A colour resulting from the mixing of two primary colours.
Artefacts	An object made by a human being, typically one of cultural or historical interest.

Collage	(The art of making) a picture in which various materials or objects, for example paper, cloth, or photographs, are stuck onto a larger surface:
