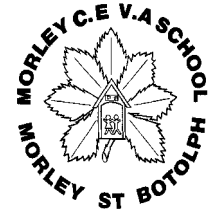

Dear Parents / carers

If any families have any old sports kit they no longer require (shorts, t-shirts, joggers etc) I would really appreciate them. I would like to set up a spare kit box so on the odd occasion that a child forgets kit or can't find a t-shirt I have something for them so they don't miss their lesson. Miss Snowling.

Our Rewards System

We are often asked by parents how our rewards system works:

Values Certificates: Given to children when they do something outstanding that shows an example of one of our values. Your child will receive at least one of these certificates during the year and they are given out during our Friday Celebration Assembly.

House Points: These are awarded in line with our Church school values for life and for sporting achievements. Examples might be: helping others; showing good team effort; going the extra distance for other people etc. Children record their house points on a class chart and the house with the most points is awarded a trophy at the end of the school year.

Merits: Merits are awarded in class by teachers, teaching assistants and learning support assistants. A merit will be awarded for individual effort or achievement. Examples might be: improving handwriting; getting spellings right; increasing the amount of independent reading that they are doing etc. The children have merit sheets and when they complete the sheets they earn a badge.
