1. Reading	Please hear your child read every day for at least 20 minutes and record this into the reading record. (You may like to split this up into two 10 minute sessions.)
2. English	<p>On Google classroom, there is a Mud Monster 'guide' that has a few literacy ideas in:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Read through the mud monster guide.2. Look up definitions of words in the mud monster guide.3. A simple adverbials task to describe what mud monsters eat.4. Some ideas for writing. <p>I hope the theme provides some inspiration. These will probably take you longer than four sessions for you to complete! Remember to look at your spellings, or try an activity from Pobble365.com from time to time.</p>

3. Spelling	In google classroom, you will now find all the spelling lists, including the new spelling list for Summer 1. Try to practise these as we would for spelling tests in school. Please continue to practise any other of the spelling lists that your child is unsure of.
4. Maths	Time - Several time activities have been set as homework on My Maths. Please help the children you complete the lesson before they try the homework! Time can be tricky to understand. Regular questions about what the time is, or allowing the children to use a watch, can really help. Times tables - Continue to practise on TT Rock Stars for 20 minutes a day. Times table knowledge will be key for moving up into the higher classes.
5. Art	On the google classroom, there is also a sheet with ideas for arts and activities with mud monsters. Any pictures would be great to see!
