What I should already know:

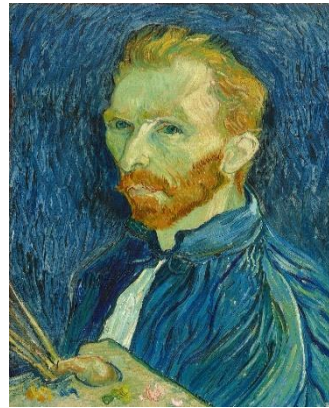
- ~How to wash and clean a brush

VOCABULARY

Artist—someone who creates artwork such as paintings, drawing, collage and sculpture

Mixing—making new colours by mixing two different colours together

Primary colours—these are red, blue and yellow

Secondary colours— these are made using the primary colours: green, purple and orange

Oil paint - Oil is added to the pigment so that the paint takes longer to dry and is then protected from the air

Line - these add detail and can be continuous or separate

Cold colours - these contain more blue

Warm colours - these contain more yellow

Medium - this can be the type of art; printing, painting, textile or the material that the art is made from
