### **Half term supermarket vouchers**

We are delighted that Norfolk County Council will continue to use the grant from the government's DWP Household Support Fund to work with food voucher company, Edenred, to provide support for all families with children eligible for means-tested Free School Meals.

Families whose children are entitled to free school lunches will receive a supermarket e-voucher to the value of £15 per child to cover the week, 14/02/22 - 18/02/22. This will be emailed on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> February.

### **Families in hardship and needing wider support**

In addition to the offer of FSM vouchers for eligible families, there is assistance available for families who are facing hardship and need support.

Anyone experiencing hardship may be able to receive support through the Norfolk Assistance Scheme (NAS), which may be able to provide support for food, fuel, clothes and other essential household items to families experiencing hardship. Wider support from a range of partners can then also be made available with NAS working alongside the Children's Services Community and Partnerships service.
