He is the highest points scorer of all time in test rugby, and is considered by many to be one of the best players of all time. He has won multiple Rugby World Cups (known as the Webb Ellis Cup.) He was part of the All-Blacks (New Zealand) team which won back to back world cups in 2011 and 2015, being regarded by many as one of the best teams of all time.</p>
