As part of our study of immigration from Europe to America we look at some of the art and design of New York.

Focus Artist – Keith Haring (Graffiti Artist – New York)



This topic allows the children to discuss how different people view art and look at modern Graffiti of New York City. They will discuss whether graffiti is art and how artists ensure that their art is seen.

Key skills: use of colour and repetition, line and block colour, focus on graffiti styles of lettering and how to create specific effects such as the illusion of depth, the

importance of negative space in designs.

They will appreciate diversity and difference by observing the autistic artist, **Steven Wiltshire**, recreate the New York Skyline from memory.
