Allergies - Updated

We have an anaphylaxis risk to **Sesame** in school. Since this condition could be lifethreatening, we are asking parents and carers to help us minimise the risks. Parents and carers should ensure that any food brought into school does not include sesame.

Our lunchtime supervisors will remind children not to share their lunches to protect those with allergies.

We have children in school with allergies so can we remind you that we are a nut-free school. Please ensure that if your child is bringing in a packed lunch, it has no nut ingredients.

We are no longer able to accept birthday treats/sweets to be distributed for a child's birthday. This applies to all classes.

Helping Out

We actively encourage parents to support us by helping out in school if you have any spare time to volunteer. Here are some suggestions:

- One of the most important ways in which you can support us, is by offering a small amount of time each week to read stories to the children or hear them read to you.
- Are you a practical person who could be of help in our afternoon art and design technology sessions or our outdoor learning sessions?
- Are you interested in finding out more about primary school teaching and would like to support the learning in a class?
- A small but dedicated team of parents regularly arrange a couple of hours on a Saturday morning for a school tidy up, eg. cleaning and clearing outdoor areas, light weeding, painting fences and play equipment etc. Could you spare a couple of hours once every half-term?

If you do have time to spare and would like to help us, please contact Mrs Ralphs to discuss times etc. Please note, that we have a policy of not placing volunteers in their own child's class.

School App

We have a school app for parents which is useful for reporting absences or other messages, seeing your child's attendance, permissions held and contact details for your child. It is also a useful tool for the school if we need to send parents a message. If you would like to use the App, it can be downloaded from your usual App store (the App is called Scholarpack). You will need a link-up code to activate the App which is generated by the school office. Please let us know if you would like a link-up code.

Anxiety in children workshop

We continue to work with the Mental Health Support Team in Schools (MHSTS) in the year ahead. The team have previously worked with parents/carers to support children with mild to moderate anxieties. This year they will be increasing their support further by delivering staff training, leading assemblies and facilitating workshops in school for pupils and parents/carers.

Coming back to school can bring a range of mixed feelings and those morning drop-offs can be tricky to begin with. Some children find it harder to leave their family members and settle back into school life and need a little help at the gate to say goodbye. Others find the change of classroom, teaching staff and new routines more difficult to manage.

Does this sound familiar? If so then why not attend out first event for parents/carers on Wednesday 20th September 2 – 3pm in the school hall at Morley. Tea, coffee and biscuits will be provided.

In this session the MHSTS team include topics such as;

- What is anxiety?
- What causes anxiety?
- When does anxiety become a problem?
- What will we see at home/school?
- How to help an anxious child

for exploring our amazing churchyard wildlife


