

RevoLOOtion- Accessible changing places at The Old Buckenham airshow

Over the last few year's Old Buckenham airshow has been delighted to welcome an ever increasing number of people with disabilities and their carers. To do this we've more than doubled the facilities available for them.

This year, thanks to the kind suggestion from a member of the Airshow audience, we've become aware of another leap in improving our facilities for disabled people; Revolootion

The initiative of the Vehicles for Change charity, RevoLOOtion enables disabled children and adults to use the toilet or be changed with dignity and respect, the service helps to break down barriers that often exclude them from participating in activities and events.

It is important to recognise that lack of appropriate facilities can be a major obstacle for disabled individuals and RevoLOOtion can make a real difference in their lives.

Inside each unit, which has a full time attendant, there are toilets, hoists and changing tables, all with plenty of space and hot water.

The RevoLOOtion will be based in the main disabled toilet area of the <u>Airshow</u> on both the 27th and 28th of July 2024.

Old Buckenham airshow offer free carers <u>tickets</u> and reduced rate tickets for disabled people (with the relevant proof).

Contact Family Hubs- they are there to support your family

Our <u>Start for Life</u> and family hubs approach supports a shared ambition that Norfolk is a place where all children and young people can <u>flourish</u>. By joining up and enhancing existing services, we want to ensure all children, young people and their parents and carers can access the early support they need when they need it.

Our family hubs approach supports parents and carers of children and young people from conception up to the age of 19-years-old (25 for young people with special educational needs and/or disabilities).

We can also help with the worries adults may have, such as finances and mental health, which may impact on children.

If you have difficulties in your family, or if you are worried about your children, there are people who can support you. If family life feels difficult to cope with, contact us to ask for help and support.

Families can access support:

Within their community in places they already visit that are part of our Start for Life and family hub network.

Virtually through online and digital platforms.

By visiting a family hub site, and talking to a relevant professional or practitioner in person.

From another parent or carer, as we develop more volunteer peer support opportunities.

Important consultation on the Non-Residential Charging Policy, in particular the Minimum Income Guarantee (MIG)

Norfolk County Council adult social services are writing to tell you about an important consultation on the Non-Residential Charging Policy, in particular the Minimum Income Guarantee.

Residents from across the county can get involved by filling in an online survey (large print and easy read versions also available) or taking part in a drop-in session at one of libraries across the county.

The Council faces difficult decisions to deliver on its ambitions for the people of Norfolk against a difficult economic climate and more than a decade of reduced funding. Each year, the Council reviews its budget and proposes the savings it will need to make for the following year to balance its budget.

We conducted our annual budget and council tax consultation for 2024/25 between October and December 2023. However, the Government's autumn statement and provisional funding settlement, which followed our budget consultation, set out a worse funding position for local authorities than had previously been anticipated.

As a result, the Council is £4m worse off than it had expected to be. We are now running consultations and one of them is about the Minimum Income Guarantee.

The consultation will run until Friday, 17th May and the council is asking people for their views on two proposed changes to the Minimum Income Guarantee.

We would value your feedback on the proposals, and we would also value your help in highlighting the consultation and encouraging people to feed back.

Next of Kin: Understanding decision making authorities

Next of Kin: Understanding decision making authorities


"The term 'Next of Kin' is often used in Health and Social Care as a euphemistic shorthand for 'Who is the person we communicate with about you and who do we contact when you are dead?' In law the term has no status when you are alive - it is misleading too because it does not clarify if this is the person who is your nearest relative or the person most important to you. Indeed, these are often different people. This helpful leaflet clarifies how people can plan ways, with those they love, to ensure their wishes are taken into account if through illness they cannot take decisions for themselves. I cannot stress enough how important it is to plan ahead and let our wishes be known, in the event we cannot express them.

As Chair of the National Mental Capacity Forum I commend this advice leaflet; we all want the best care provided in accordance with our wishes and this leaflet helps everyone understand how to ensure that happens."

Norfolk reading pathway- for adults

One in six adults struggles with reading. Research shows that when people read for pleasure they benefit from far greater opportunities in everyday life, education and employment.

The Norfolk Reading Pathway is a free programme which is available across Norfolk and is open to any adult who would like support to become a more confident reader.

We match learners with one of our volunteer coaches and they work through the 'Yes we can read' handbook together. Coaching sessions are usually weekly for up to an hour.

The Pathway is available in all Norfolk Libraries.

- 1. Practitioner Tutor a professional who uses their clinical and learned experience to deliver the session.
- 2. Peer Tutor a student who has attended Recovery or Discovery College and uses their lived experience to deliver the session.
