Our learning for the first half term will focus around

- Outdoor Education This will be on a weekly basis. Even though the weather should be more pleasant, please ensure that your child still has a pair of wellies and waterproofs. We will be looking at seasonal change, flowering plants and doing some creative activities too!
- Value for Life As a Church of England school, we follow the values for life, and this term it is Friendship. Please do take every opportunity to chat to your child about this as we will be reflecting on forgiveness as part of Collective Worship and as part of daily school life.
